Tampa #1 in nation for computer hacker attacks

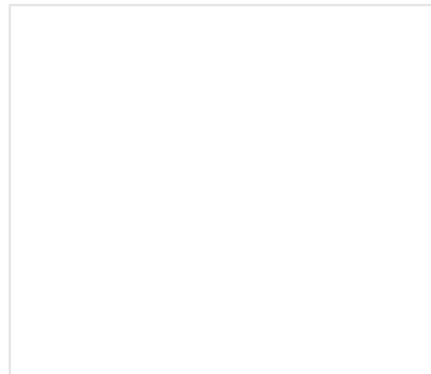
Tampa has just been named the most-hacked city in the nation. Why us? And what can you do to protect yourself?

Tampa, FL -- Tampa is number one in the nation, but not for the reason you might hope.

A new study from EnigmaSoftware.com finds our region is the single-most hacked spot in the country when it comes to people's personal computers.

That keeps places like Performance Computer Group in South Tampa plenty busy, servicing computers hacked or hijacked by viruses and malicious software.



"Approximately 70 percent of the repairs we do is a virus removal," said owner Brett Kappes.

According to the study, Tampa is a whopping 561 percent above than the national average when it comes to computer infections on a per-capita basis.

The reasons, according to Enigma, include a rapidly increasing population and, well... pornography.

"They're one of the most common places for malware for hacking getting downloaded to your computer, etc," warns Sri Sridharan, who leads Florida's Center for Cyber Security located at the University of South Florida.

The program is helping train the next generation of cyber-sleuths to head off hack attacks. With a sophisticated program, they can monitor the almost-constant, real-time bombardment of hacking attempts from around the world.

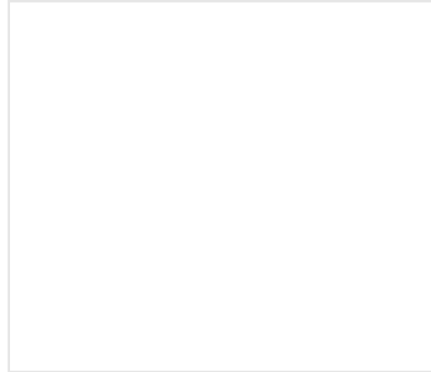
Tampa, says Sridharan, is a perfect storm of cyber vulnerability: elderly people who aren't cyber savvy, and often do not take enough precaution to safeguard their computers. Also, young people who aren't careful enough on social media, he says.

Tampa is also home to Military installations, universities and research labs. They're all prime hacker targets.

"And I think we saw in 2014 is only a minuscule amount of what you're going to see down the road, in the next year to two years," Sridharan warns.

Computer experts say they see no short-term solution in sight. Their advice includes protecting yourself and your personal computer by making sure you have the most recent update version of your cyber software.

Also, make sure you back up your personal computer files either with an external hard drive separate from your computer, or by using a cloud-based service to be able to retrieve a previous version of your files if corrupted.



Sridharan also suggests:

- Using complex passwords
- hanging passwords often
- Do not open external links from people you don't know
- Don't click on unfamiliar attachments
- Avoid using free or unsecured Wi-Fi
- Don't share personal info on social media
