Folks in the New York/Northern New Jersey/Long Island and Los

Angeles/Long Beach/Santa Ana metropolitan areas are most prone to spyware problems, according to analysis by Enigma Software Group, makers of anti-spyware SpyHunter.

When findings were adjusted for each state's population, Alaska, Colorado and New Hampshire had the highest rates of infection. California had the most infections, but it also has the most people and
